### What will happen at my appointment?

You will be met by a support worker, who will guide you through your assessment and explain what's happening at every stage. You can bring a friend, family member or carer with you if you like. The length of your assessment will depend on what your needs are. Refreshments and lunch are provided free of charge.

The people involved in your assessment will meet to talk about what they think would be best for your care. They will share a care plan with you and your GP within seven working days.

## Who is in the team at the Jean Bishop Integrated Care Centre?

Because we want to make sure you get the care you need, we have a team of highly qualified and experienced staff including nurses, consultants, GPs, therapists (e.g. physiotherapists and occupational therapists), pharmacists and a social care team. Your carer will have the chance to talk to the Carers'

Information and Support Service about their needs.
